1.	17/013	Welcome and apologies for absence Apologies tendered and accepted as above	
2.	17/014	<b>Public observations/questions on agenda items</b> To suspend the business of the Council to allow members of the public to make observations or put questions to the Council about items on the agenda.	
		Parishioner <b>VM</b> raised concerns about the speed of traffic through the village, particularly in Romsey Road, past the school. Proposed the installation of '20's Plenty' signs, suggesting that these can help to change people's behaviour, have been proven to reduce accidents and help reduce the severity of impact injuries. Has discussed the issue with Awbridge School and looked at a self-help approach involving the purchase of 20's Plenty signs and affixing these to existing speed limit signs, and possibly telegraph poles, near the school.	
		<ul> <li>In the course of an open discussion, the following points were made:</li> <li>The need to investigate the legal position of erecting the signs and their legal status.</li> <li>Whether the signs are necessary, given the slowing effect of traffic congestion near the school at pupil drop-off and pick-up times.</li> <li>SP asked to supply Parish Council with contact details of colleague who can be approached concerning the siting of the police speed camera vehicle. Current location in Awbridge does not maximise impact and an alternative location has been identified.</li> </ul>

		<b>CD</b> volunteered to liaise with parishioner <b>VM</b> to pull things together. This was formally proposed by <b>PA</b> and seconded by <b>AH. Resolved.</b>	
		Parishioner VM suggested creating a risk management report. NAK highlighted the Test Valley Borough Councillors Community Grant Scheme as a possible source of part-funding.	CD
		<b>PA</b> informed that data collected by community speedwatch volunteers cannot be used as evidence to prosecute. Drivers may get a visit from the police in some instances. <b>TJ</b> felt that the deterrence aspect of CSW was important. <b>SP</b> advised that CSW schemes are more about the prevention of speeding, rather than prosecution. They need a number of volunteers to form a pool. Offered to come to Awbridge Primary School to speak to parents about CSW and to arrange a visit to the King Somborne CSW group. Might also be possible to share their equipment.	
		<b>RP</b> advised caution regarding the possible proliferation of signs and suggested that Hampshire County Council (HCC) may have some 20s plenty signs available. Advised that the parish council would have to submit a letter of endorsement to HCC Highways supporting erection of the signs. HCC Highways would, in turn, base consideration of granting permission on traffic flow and accident statistics. Mentioned community speed watch (CSW) as an alternative approach to attempts to reduce the speed of traffic. Romsey Extra have a speed watch kit which they haven't manage to use.
